

Armed Forces Mission

Building Resilience ~ Restoring Hope

Dear Friend,

Hopefully we are all reminded this week that "Many have given some, but some have given all" and we will faithfully honor the memory of America's fallen, not just once a year, but every day by living out the ideals and values that make America strong. As I spoke this morning I had a wonderful time and was thankful for the opportunity, but at the same time deep in my heart I was reminded of how weary I have become in the battle. I shared a message today entitled, "If They Could Speak". If somehow we could hear the voices of those who have died in service to our country perhaps we would hear them say, "Remember my battle buddies who now fight all alone on the battlefield of personal despair." In the past 10 years more than 77,000 veterans made their final decision; and now we have reached an epidemic 22 veterans a day who end their lives. Just last night I was informed of two teenagers in my hometown that ended their lives this week. They were not veterans, but suicide is not the exclusive domain of the military. We are all impacted by the tide of hopelessness.

It also dawned on me this morning what a stubborn and prideful human being I am. The thing that I have told broken soldiers and veterans not to do is the very thing I am guilty of myself. I constantly tell those who are hurting to "ask for help" when they need it, but I refuse to do so, because I let pride get in the way. Maybe it's the nature of human beings or perhaps it is the culture of the military, or maybe it's just me - I don't like to ask for help. I suppose that in our minds, at least in mine, I am afraid that I will appear weak, and for a guy who has lived in the gym for more than 35 years, weakness was never an option. With such attitude pride gets in the way of our healing. By stubborn refusal to ask for help we cut our mission and even our very lives short.

So I am putting this out for those who have "ears to hear". Armed Forces Mission (AFM) needs your help. I NEED YOUR HELP, not for my sake alone, but for the sake of the mission and the sake of those on the abyss contemplating the decision of life or death. Since our inception we have not taken one dime of government support. Some have said we should, but we chose to believe there would be those who would rise to the occasion to meet the needs that would help in the accomplishment of the mission. I am thankful for the many individuals, families and private organizations that have stood by our side allowing us to stand with those who are hurting. Your support has enabled AFM to:

- Serve more than 25,000 service members
- Average 20 suicide intervention per quarter
- Train more than 2000 community caregivers in suicide intervention
- Issue 1000s of hours of continuing education credit for training
- Deliver more than 1000 care packages of hope to deploying soldiers
- Participate in dignified transfers of fallen service members
- Raise community awareness on local and world news radio
- Establish a track record of success on a shoestring budget

I am thankful for the lives we have been able to save. Hopefully we have made an impact as well on many that we will never know about because one of those 2000 AFM trained care givers was there to intervene. But at this time the situation is now critical for AFM.

I am not whining nor am I complaining; but simply stating several facts. Over the past three years my family has lived on a salary that is below the poverty threshold. The majority of funds that have come in to AFM have gone directly to mission and program support, as it should be and our books are open for any and all to exam. So I have some very important personal decisions knocking on my door. Do I step away from the mission and get a "real job" as some have suggested or do I make the need known and see what happens? Believe me a "real" job would be nice. I could put in my 40 hours and be done. There would be no more midnight calls and 48 hours without sleep coming as result of not being able to sleep because the nightmares of a 1000 soldiers have become my own. But I have opted for the latter.

I believe that in making the need known that there will be those who do rise to the occasion and answer the call to sustain a mission that is literally saving human lives. I have opted to surround myself with compassionate caregivers who care for me as I care for others, who help keep me balanced for the work of the mission. No one human being can do this work alone. I am thankful for the handful of volunteers who have contributed thousands of hours without pay to help me stay focused and to help others in our classes and in the community who are struggling. Certainly, the easy thing to do would be to walk away, to throw in the towel and to let others take up the cause, but then I pull out a letter I received from the spouse of a young veteran and read...

"When we needed someone the most we met you. I have to believe it was in order to save his life. If it wasn't for your caring and support and being by our side throughout all this he might not be here today." Kim R.

So this afternoon as I sit in my sunroom listening for the third time to the song Surrender by Lincoln Brewster the stubborn pride is broken.

I'm giving you my dreams, Laying down my rights

Giving up my pride, for the promise of new life

And I surrender, all to you

All to you

For the past three years as Executive Director of Armed Forces Mission, as difficult as it has been I have been living my dream; a dream of serving others and saving lives, but today I lay down my right to live my dreams. The only way the mission will continue is by giving up my stubborn pride. The promise of a renewed mission and life for Armed Forces Mission is the way of surrender.

Therefore, I humbly ask you to become a battle buddy with me. We are seeking 300 such battle buddies who can give just \$19 a month or some other amount to continue the work. Through faithful stewardship and great passion for the mission we will continue the work and many more lives will be saved. Every penny counts and will be used wisely to continue the work of serving those who have served our nation and given much for the freedoms we enjoy as citizens of the United States of America. Additionally, we will continue to reach out to all on the battlefield because of our creed as Soldiers to serve the people of the United States of America and to leave no one behind.

Thank you for allowing me to share with you this afternoon.
